2 FACING CHARGES IN 9-CITY GAMBLING

MIAMI, Jan. 9 (UPI)—Kenneth Hanna, arrested by the Federal Bureau of Investigation yesterday as part of a nine-city crackdown on a gambling scheme, is to appear before a United States Commissioner tomorrow morning for arraignment on Federal gambling charges.

Mr. Hanna is accused of using a so-called "blue box"—an electronic device hooked to his telephone—to avoid being charged for some 500 long-distance calls.

The F.B.I., which conducted searches in four locations other than Mr. Hanna's apartment, said the ring also had used faked credit cards to make long-distance calls. The calls were charged to nonexistent companies.

The other cities involved were New York, Jersey City, Baltimore, New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Cleveland, Huntington, W. Va., and Clarksdale, Miss. The only other arrest made was that of Nat Modell in New York City.

The residences of Gilbert Lee Beckley, Morton Kane and Martin Skarloff also were searched in the Miami phase of the raids. They were not arrested, as erroneously reported yesterday.
