JURY INDICTS PAIR IN 'BLACK BOX' PLOT

Two men who allegedly used a "black box" device to make long distance telephone calls without activating the telephone company's billing mechanism were indicted Tuesday by the county grand jury.

Indictments of five counts each were returned against Louis G. MacKenzie, 49, owner of MacKenzie Laboratores, 1367 N. Fair Oaks Ave., Pasadena, and á laboratory employe, Robert La-Fond.

James Haggin, an undercover investigator employed by Pacific Telephone Co., reportedly claimed that he purchased one of the electronic devices from MacKenzie for \$250.

MacKenzie and LaFond, who had no immediate comment, are expected to surrender for arraignment in Superior Court on Friday.
