3 Indicted in Phone Fraud

Three men accused of trying to sell little "black boxes" capable of making free long distance telephone calls were charged with conspiracy last night in indictments voted by the Grand Jury.

Donald M. Bellinger, 26, former stockbroker, and Richard Rose, 33, clothing store operator, were arrested Oct. 14 in the office of Arthur Dettner Jr., owner of a printing firm at 835 Howard St.

Dettner had earlier told po-

lice the pair had demonstrated a "multi-frequency signal generating device" about the size of a cigarette pack.

Free long distance calls could be made by attaching the device to the telephone, according to Bellinger and Rose.

Dettner told Inspectors Martin Barbero and Jack Toomey he gave the men \$500, with the transaction tape recorded by Pacific Telephone security men. He said the men were to get \$500 more later.

The third man, Robert J. Winegardner Jr., 31, also a former stockbroker, later surrendered.

The jury also voted to indict:

- Mrs. Bonnie Felice, 25, for the slaying of her husband, William M. Felice, 42, owner of a tavern at 21 Taylor St. Oct. 25.

- Carl D. Jones, 31, and William Lowery, 27, for the \$6000 robbery of a jewelry store owned by Arthur Lowman, a cripple, at 1123 Taraval St.
