Three Indicted in 'Black Box' Case

A stockbroker and two other men who were arrested after demonstrating mysterious — and potentially lucrative — "black boxes" capable of making free long distance telephone calls were charged with conspiracy in indictments voted by the Grand Jury last night.

The trio — broker Donald M. Bellenger, 26, of 155 Varrennes street; former broker Robert J. Winegardner Jr., 31, of 102 Alta street, and Montgomery street clothier Richard Rose, 33, of 2600 Union street — showed the ingenious device to printing executive Arthur Dettner in the office of his firm on October 14, police said.

Dettner, officer said, agreed to buy one of the "multi-frequency signal generating devices" — slightly larger than a king-size pack of cigarettes — for \$1000 and then tipped police.

Armed with information from Dettner and other sources, police obtained a search warrant and later

seized several of the black boxes and other exotic electronic equipment at Bellenger's home.

The three were specifically charged in the indictment with conspiring to obtain telephone services with intent to defraud.
