'Blue Box' Suspects Plead No Contest

DETROIT (AP) — Two suburban Detroit men entered no contest pleas Friday in U.S. District Court in Detroit on charges they used an illegal electronic device to place free long distance calls.

David Leone, 32, president of the Diversified Management Agency in St. Clair Shores, and his employe, Richard J. Krajniak, 22, of Ypsilanti, were arrested last week after FBI agents confiscated three of the so-called "blue boxes" in a raid on the agency as part of a nationwide crackdown on the devices.
