Abstract Excerpts from two FBI files regarding Anthony P. Glorioso. One (-80) describes 13 defendents who, together with certain telephony company long lines repairmen, conspired to defraud the United States of gambling excise tax and the 10% excise tax on long distance telephone service. [...] defendants attempted to conceal ... the existence and scope of their widespread horserace betting and other gambling activities by concealing their long distance telephone service through the services of telephone company long lines repairmen... the defendants secured free unauthorized long distance telephone service." The other (-70) shows how the FBI used records of NY Tel to determine that the bad guys made approximately 25 interstate telephone calls daily to telephone numbers in Cleveland, OH and New Orleans, LA.

Sometime previous to 1958, ANTHONY P. GLORIOSO, was an installer for Southern Bell Telephone Company.

Informant advised 6/19/67, that he is familiar with ROCK GLORIOSO as an individual who has lived in New Orleans for numerous years and was formerly known as a better and small-time bookmaker. Informant was not certain of GLORIOSO's present activities but believes him to still be mainly a better on horse races.

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Source advised that FRANK TIMPHONY and ANTHONY GLORIOSA often are seen together and associate with each other and have the same type operation. Source stated he did not know, however, if they were actually connected financially in their betting activities.

He stated that while some of these individuals may possibly be engaged in bookmaking activities, the room is primarily a place where individual gamblers can determine information regarding various horse races throughout the country and He explained that this address was previously used by SAM DIPIAZZI, also known as RUBINOFF [redacted] and ANTHONY GLORIOSO and in recent months this group has dropped out and a group consisting of [redacted] have been utilizing this address [redacted]

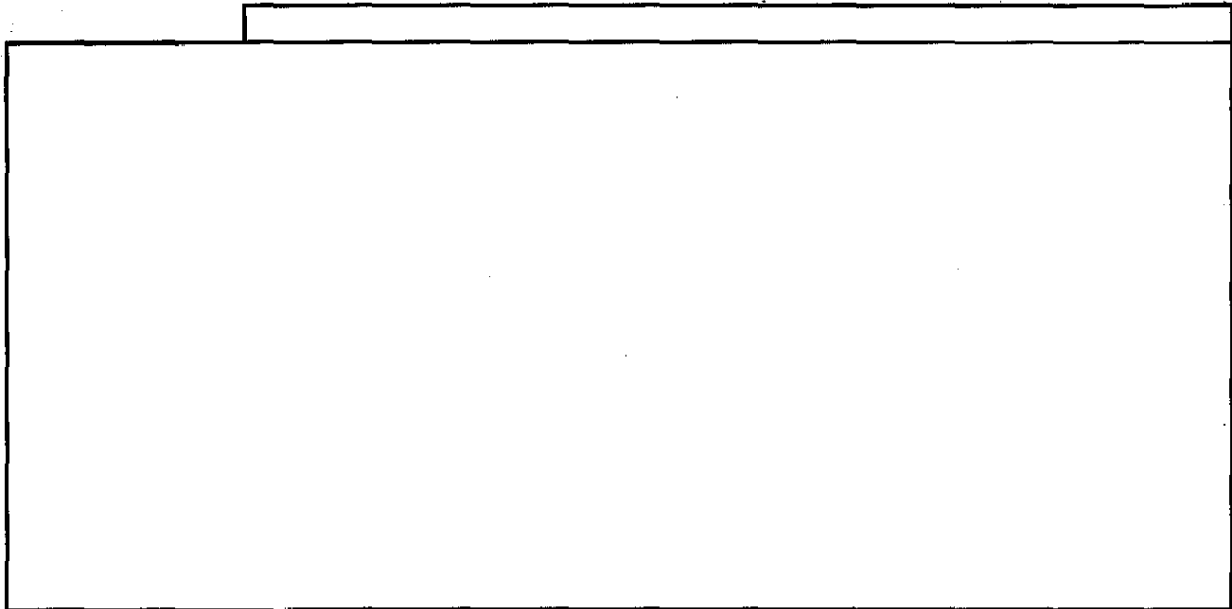
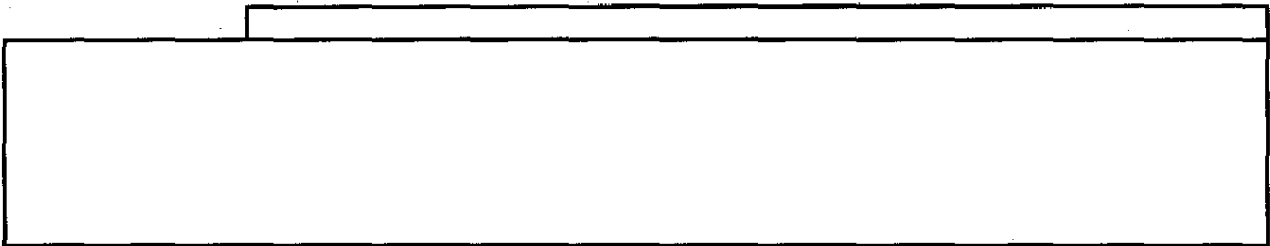

"All of the above-named individuals were indicted in the Eastern District of Louisiana at New Orleans, La., on June 27, 1961, with six other subjects for conspiring to defraud the United States and also for committing fraud by wire. The N.Y. and N.O. Offices are to immediately review their files regarding each of these individuals and prepare a comprehensive letterhead memorandum on each, suitable for dissemination to the Department. The letterhead memo are to be submitted to the Bureau within 5 days of receipt of this communication."

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[redacted] on July 13, 1957 advised that Anthony Glorioso is a partner of DiPiazze in the operation of a hand-book at 1609 Angela Street, Arabi, Louisiana, a suburb of New Orleans. [redacted] advised that Glorioso also operated a

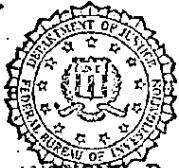

barroom on Esplanade Avenue [redacted] advised that Glorioso has been active in gambling interests in New Orleans for many years but is in no manner a suspect in violent criminal action. [redacted] advised that Glorioso confines his illegal operations to gambling and has never been known to carry firearms. On [redacted] advised that Glorioso had been gambling heavily and had lost a considerable amount of money. [redacted] advised that Glorioso still helped operate the handbook at 1809 Angela Street, Arabi, Louisiana, but had very little financial backing to lend to the operation.

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On April 14, 1958, [redacted] advised that approximately three months prior to this date the telephone company had located an extension on the pay telephone outside Anthony's Bar and Grill, 2101 Esplanade Avenue. This extension had been run inside the bar and was used in connection with a handbook operation. This bar was owned by Anthony P. Glorioso, a former installer for the telephone company. This telephone connection was disconnected as soon as it was located.

92-346-17 pg #32 & pg #33. Is report by SA [redacted] New Orleans, dated 3/7/62 entitled, "CRIME CONDITIONS IN LOUISIANA, AR." Under heading INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE INVESTIGATION OF GAMBLERS DEFRAUDING UNITED STATES OF GAMBLING EXCISE TAXES, reflects in part the following information.

"On February 2, 1962, SA [redacted] examined the file concerning Criminal Action 28247, which file is maintained by the Clerk, U.S. District Court, New Orleans. This file pertains to the criminal action officially entitled, "United States Against BENJAMIN LASSOFF, ET AL." The file reflected that on June 27, 1961, a Federal Grand Jury in New Orleans returned an indictment charging the following thirteen gamblers with violation of Sections 371 and 1343, Title 18, U.S. Code, for Conspiracy to Defraud the United States and Fraud by Wire:

- "CHARLES A. PEREZ, 3030 Grand Route St., John, New Orleans.

"The indictment charges that these thirteen defendants, together with [redacted] SIMON KLAYMAN, [redacted] and certain Telephone Co. long lines repairmen conspired to defraud the United States of gambling excise taxes and the 10% excise tax on long distance telephone service. As part of the conspiracy, the defendants endeavored to conceal from Internal Revenue Service the existence and scope of their widespread horse race betting and other gambling activities by concealing their long distance telephone activity, by securing free unauthorized long distance telephone service through the services of Telephone Company long lines repairmen, as a consequence of which no records were made concerning telephone calls made by the defendants. As a further part of the conspiracy, the defendants secured free unauthorized long distance telephone service, thereby preventing the Telephone Company from billing them for this service, including the 10% excise tax imposed on long distance telephone calls, with the result that the United States was defrauded of this revenue.

"The file concerning this action reflects that March 21, 1962 has been set as the date for hearings on motions filed by all of the defendants in this case. These defendants have filed motions to dismiss the indictment, motions for Bills of Particulars, and motions for severance of counts and defendants. The file reflects that U.S. District Judge J. SKELLY WRIGHT has set May 21, 1962, as the trial date in this case.

ANTHONY P. GLORIOSA, aka., "Rock" Gloriosa (continued).

"With regard to ANTHONY P. GLORIOSO, one of the defendants in the investigation conducted by Internal Revenue Service, it is to be noted that this individual was interviewed by agents of the New Orleans Office on December 6, 1961. GLORIOSO was interviewed at [redacted] Louisiana. He advised his residence address is 2101 Esplanade Avenue, New Orleans, but he admitted he had been staying at [redacted] with [redacted] for for approximately eight months, because [redacted]

[redacted] GLORIOSO admitted having formerly been a bookmaker working with SAM DI PIAZZI in the New Orleans area. He said that, at the present time, he is merely doing a little horse race handicapping and betting for himself. GLORIOSO said that telephone numbers [redacted] are physically located in the living room of the residence at [redacted] and that both of these telephones belong to [redacted]

"GLORIOSO was questioned concerning any contacts he may have had by long distance telephone with [redacted] of the Cincinnati News Service, a race wire service operating in Newport, Kentucky. GLORIOSO denied knowing [redacted] or having been in contact with him. GLORIOSO claimed he had not been engaged in betting or bookmaking outside of Louisiana, since he was indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in New Orleans in June, 1961."

"Records of the Clerk, U. S. District Court, New Orleans, showed on December 17, 1962, that on December 17, 1962, Judge HERBERT W. CHRISTENBERRY continued the trial date to January 3, 1963, and that one of the defendants, SAM DI PIAZZA, had been severed from the trial because of a heart condition.

"The remaining defendants listed are ANTHONY P. GLORIOSA, EUGENE A. NOLAN, [redacted] ROBERT LASSOFF, BENJAMIN LASSOFF, MYRON DECKLEBAUM, ALFRED REYN, [redacted] and ALFRED MONES."

He said [redacted] has made a small fortune during the current year and apparently receives the backing of the Italian criminal element in New Orleans. His present working phone # is 279-7434. His present partners are ROCK GLORIOSA and [redacted] (phonetic)."

CC memo SA [redacted] for [redacted] entitled, [redacted] dated [redacted] Dates of contact [redacted] Page #7 under heading RE: 92-515, reflects in part the following information. "On 4/9/65, informant stated that [redacted] was primarily at the present engaged in [redacted] and leaving the majority of the bookmaking activity to ROCK GLORIOSA. He said GLORIOSA obtains very good 'Horse Figures.'

[redacted] advised that he knew subject [redacted] To the best of informant's knowledge, subject never employed in gambling industry in the N.O. area and has been associated with gambling in Las Vegas for the first time.

"Informant stated that the individual referred to in Las Vegas letter of 3/30/66 as 'BIG SAM' from New Orleans would most likely be SAM DI PIAZZO, well-known local horse book, but informant did not know of any association between subject and DI PIAZZO. Informant indicated that in the past [redacted]

[redacted] had been [redacted] whose identity is known to the Las Vegas Office. Informant stated that although it was pure speculation on his part subject would most likely be contacting ANTHONY GLORIOSO, who is a local gambler presently believed to be operating with [redacted] a local gambler who is also the subject of an AR investigation in this office.

"It is known that DI PIAZZO and GLORIOSO make all long distance telephone calls from pay phones in the downtown area of New Orleans. Based on information reported in Las Vegas letter of 3/30/66, it appears that subject

initiated all of the calls from New Orleans, which would preclude identifying any numbers called by subject in the New Orleans Division.

"Detective [redacted] assigned to the Detective Bureau, NOPD, New Orleans, La., advised that he was on the Flamingo 'Junket' that left New Orleans on April 19, 1967, via Delta Airlines to Las Vegas, Nevada, returning to New Orleans, the early A.M., of April 23, 1967.

[redacted] stated that he has been acquainted with [redacted] who apparently is a local representative of the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas, insofar as arranging for local people to take the 'Junket' to Las Vegas.

[redacted] stated that he was not required to pledge any money to anyone before he took the 'Junket' and that the transportation and lodging in Las Vegas, at the Flamingo Hotel cost him nothing. His only expenses were his personal items he purchased and limited gambling at the casino. He stated he and three or four friends had gotten together to go on this flight as a group, and they did not particularly associate to any degree with the other one hundred and thirty some other persons on the 'Junket.' [redacted] stated he has been a police officer for some twenty years and knows a lot of the local gamblers and small-time hoodlums. He did note on the flight and after arrival in Las Vegas, some of the New Orleans gamblers, such as SAM DI PIAZZA, ROCK GLORIOSA, and other small-time hoodlums, such as [redacted]

[redacted] and others were on the 'Junket'; however, he stated the large majority of the individuals on the 'Junket' were prominent business and professional people in the Greater New Orleans area."

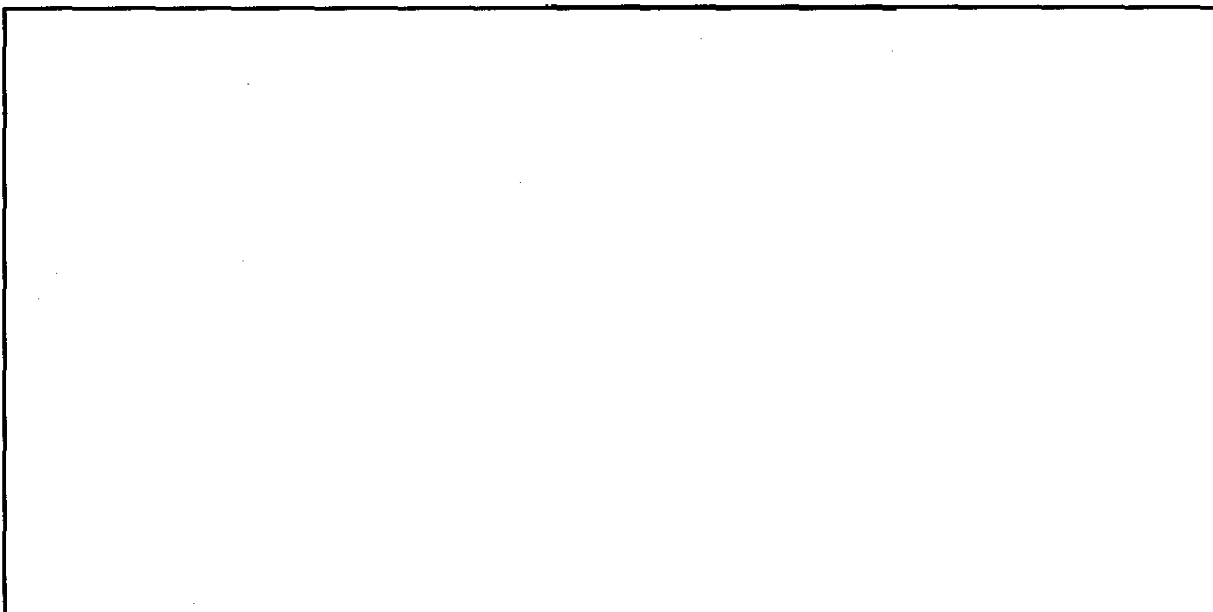
