The FBI advised that an investigation conducted by their

Los Angeles Field Office disclosed that "Phone Freaks" on the

West Coast found a way of automatically entering the AUTOVON system.

On 22-24 January 1976, a joint FBI/NSA town conducted an investigation

in the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas to determine if and how

Such access is gained through Alaska which does not have a standard AUTOVON Switch. Ostensibly, the purpose of entering into AUTOVON is just to be able to do it; but one of the Phone Freaks interviewed stated that if he wanted to he could also create a Flash Override precedence and create havor in the system. In fact, one of the procedures he described for entering the system through Alaska utilizes a Priority precedence.
